In an installation named The trip of empty bottles, Déniz welcomes those who have achieved his native island aboard a rickety boat. It's not like before, when the stranger was warmly welcomed and invited to sit at the family table. At the time, welcoming the weary traveler was obvious and, in exchange, the host also benefited: listening to the exciting adventures of the guest.

Today, love of neighbor is barely in our agenda. Only a few have interest in listening to the adventures of the poor traveler. As differences are accentuated in the world increasingly, the number of migrants grows substantially, therefore, that the individual is lost in anonymity. Let's keep our ears open to the stories of others. Maybe so we'll discover that we all share the same dreams and desires.

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
